

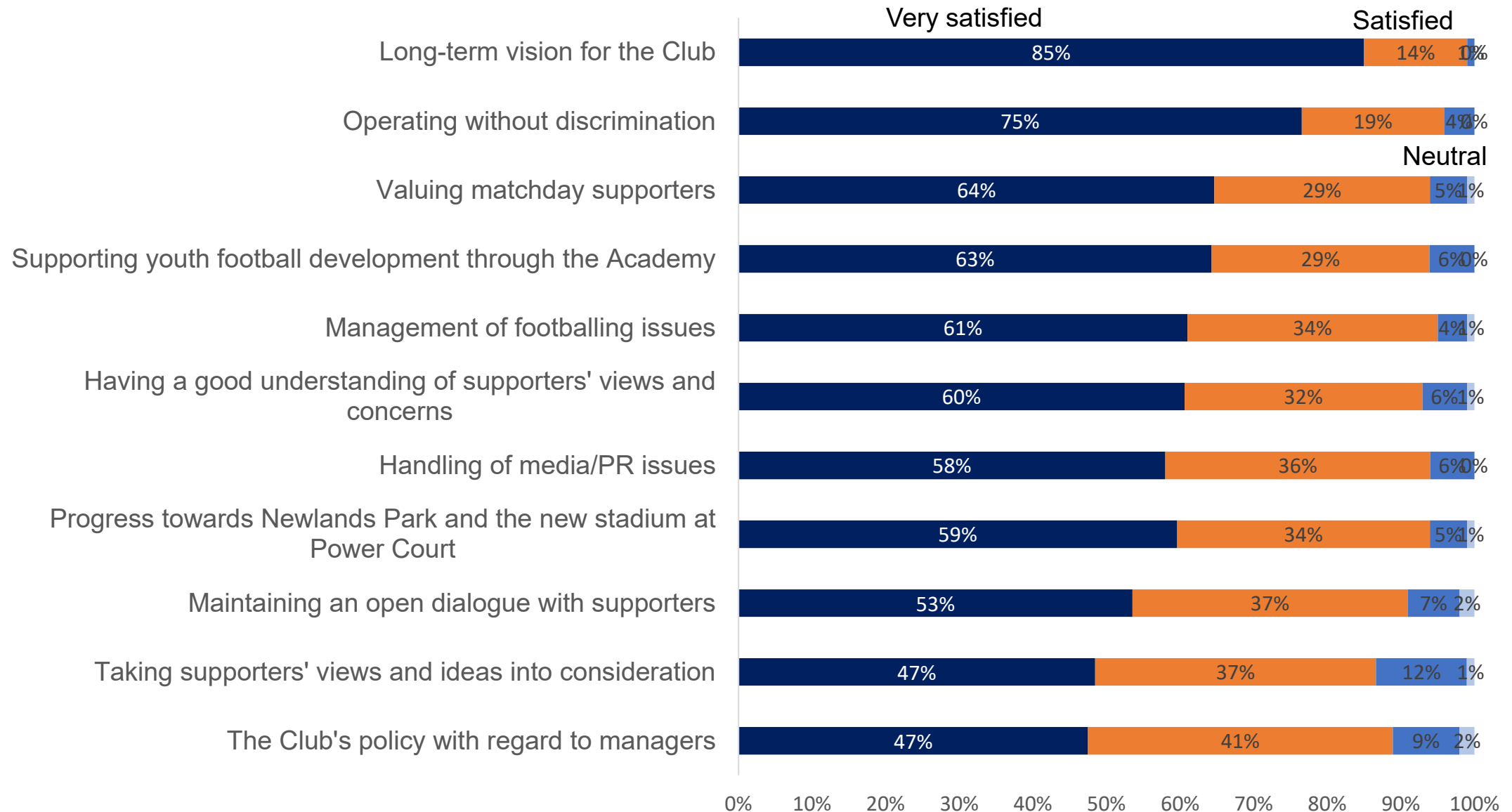

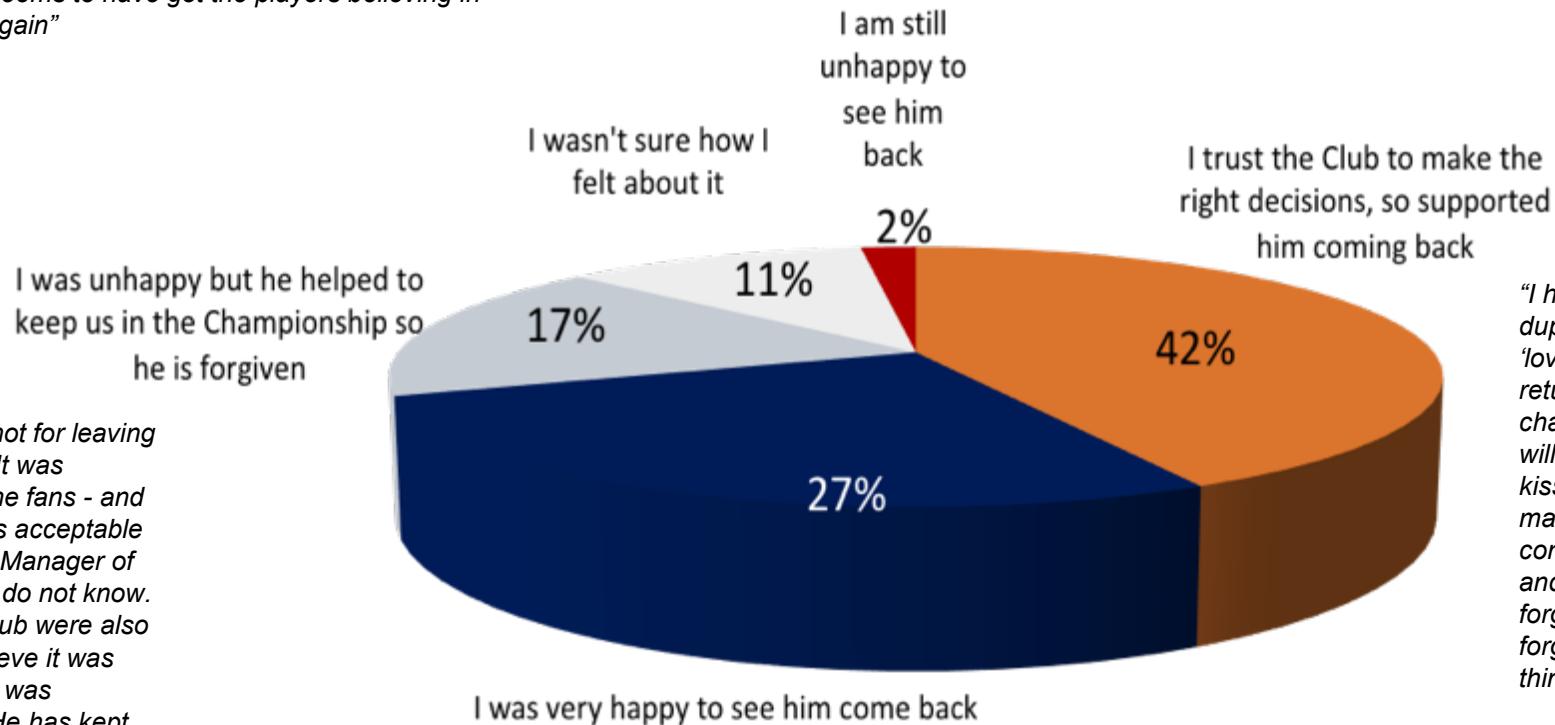

Views on Nathan Jones coming back to Luton Town

Q Which of the following statements would you say is closest to your view of Nathan Jones coming back as manager?

"At first I found it baffling by him coming back after leaving how he did, but we are all human and make mistakes and he made a great difference to keep us up and judging by the first 2 games he seems to have got the players believing in themselves again"

"The manner in which he left is still inexcusable to me; happy to see less chest-thumping thus far, but I'm not convinced he wouldn't jump ship again if the opportunity presented itself."



"I was very angry with Nathan - not for leaving but for the way in which he left. It was disrespectful to the club and to the fans - and how he could have thought it was acceptable to appear in a Stoke shirt for the Manager of the month that he won at Luton I do not know. I know the management at the club were also furious with him. And if they believe it was the right thing to do for our club I was prepared to give him a chance. He has kept us up. I'm not sure he is entirely forgiven but I'll give him the benefits of the doubt for now."

"Amazed he was let back in the building given the way he left, but did trust the judgement of the board."

"Nathan is a real motivator and tactician"

"He brought most the players to the club with MH, he knows the club. It was the right decision."

"He was probably the only manager who could have kept us in the Championship. It's a pity his head was turned by Stoke City but we have to put that behind us and move forward. He is passionate and a great motivator. Only time will tell but he has got over the first hurdle by keeping us up."

"I hated him for the way he left. I think we felt duped as we all bought into his passion and 'love' for the club. But I recognised that his return was the right move for the club and a chance for his redemption. I believe the fans will remain cautious and I think the badge kissing days are over. But I respect him as a manager and am hugely optimistic for the coming season. It was a brave move for him and though what happened won't easily be forgotten, as far as I'm concerned, he is forgiven. I'm glad to have him here because I think he is the best man for the job."
